CAMPOREE GUIDELINES

- 1. To help defray expenses of the Camporee, fees are charged for each person attending.
- 2. Each club is responsible for transportation to and from the Camporee site. Drivers must be responsible, mature individuals and at least 21 yrs. Old (Driver Questionnaire (under insurance at GCC Manual Online should be completed by each driver). Vehicles must be in good condition with <u>ADEQUATE INSURANCE</u>. The number of passengers must not exceed the number of seat belts available. NO 15-PASSENGER VANS.
- 3. The director must provide all registration information to camporee personnel immediately upon arrival. Registration lists will be in alphabetical order by staff and Pathfinders. Bring your list in alphabetical order for ease in registering.
- 4. Clubs may occupy their assigned sites any time after 12:00 noon on April 16th. No exceptions for earlier set-up will be made as the field will not be ready before that time. Plan to arrive and set up before the evening program, you will receive program information prior to the event.
- 5. Following camp set-up, please remember (as vehicles take up valuable space) that only vehicles necessary for camping and will not be moved until Sunday may stay in the camping area. Only maintenance/administrative vehicles will be allowed to operate on the field all other vehicles must remain parked until camporee is over.
- **6.** Each club is self-sustaining. This means that each club will have its own food, cooking equipment, bedding, tents, tables, and everything needed for the Camporee. Food preparation can be done by units or by club. Water source will be some distance from most campsites; appropriate containers should be brought to provide for your water needs. Gray water may not be dumped outside of designated areas. There is no trash pick-up service so plan to transport your trash to the trash dumpsters. Transport methods suggestions: Use wagons or a crew of Pathfinders. **Please place all trash in trash bags (bio-degradable is best)**
- 7. The camping arrangements are by club. Each club is responsible for providing separate boy and girl camping accommodations (1-5 ratios). Each group of five Pathfinders must have one counselor (**over 21 years of age**) assigned to it. This counselor must be mature enough to assume full responsibility for the boys or girls in the unit and should be with them at all times!
- 8. Tents and all equipment must be aligned in a neat and satisfactory manner.
- 9. Camporee gate is closed at 10:00 p.m. every night. All guests must leave the camp grounds the evening they arrived. (Day passes are for daytime guests only and not for camporee attendees).

10. Campfires:

- **A.** Club must bring wood if planning a unit campfire
- B. Only one campfire per club and it must be lit in a fire ring not directly on the ground
- **C.** Campfire should NEVER BE LEFT UNATTENDED!
- **D.** Wood should be completely cool before thrown into the dumpsters

11. DO NOT BRING:

- A. Pets animals of any kind
- **B.** All forms of music players or T.V.'s
- **C.** Fireworks
- **D.** Motorcycles or Bicycles
- E. In-line skates, skateboards, roller blades, etc.
- 12. Units and staff MUST sit together during programs. Please be on time to all appointments. Others will be sharing camporee facilities during this weekend; please be courteous.
- 13. For Camporee event participation, boys and girls units may be mixed.
- 14. Accidents must be reported immediately to the club director, then to the Conference Director. Appropriate forms must also be filled out by the Club Director and mailed to the Georgia-Cumberland Conference office, Attention: Pathfinders and/or Rick Claus, NOT TO RISK MANAGEMENT or the MEDICAL FACILITY.
- 15. Complete assigned clean-up duties throughout the weekend.
- 16. Director must complete the checkout process before leaving on Sunday in order to pick up patches, etc. Please have your club complete their Sunday clean up assignment before check-out.
