BOARD SAWING

PARTICIPANTS: I Pathfinder from each club

EQUIPMENT: 2 x 8 board, 22 to 30 inches long

Good hand saw

Tri-square

Pencil (better bring extras just in case)

PROCEDURE:

At the sound of the gun the Pathfinder will make a line across the board four (4) inches from the end (on side measuring 7 5/8 inches).

Next, he draws a line down the edge (on the side measuring 1 5/8 inches).

Next, he makes a line on the other side of the board (on the side measuring 7 5/8 inches). Note: This line is not required, but may be helpful in making a square cut.

Saw the four (4) inch piece off

SCORING:

Accuracy is important as well as speed. This event will be timed with stop watches. Judges will check the cut and subtract one (1) second for each 1/8 inch the cut is out of square at any point.

Set time limits such as:

1 minute10 points1½ minutes7 points2 minutes5 points2½ minutes3 points



NAIL DRIVING

PARTICIPANTS: 5 Pathfinders

JUDGES:

I Judge per team

EQUIPMENT:

I Hammer per team. (To be

furnished by team)

(Hatchets or lathing hammers

are not permitted) A piece of wood

#8 penny nails for each

contestant.

PROCEDURE:

Each club is given a piece of 4 x 4 wood, and 4 nails per

contestant.

PATHFINDER number I takes nail and hammer and proceeds to drive his nails into block. When finished Pathfinder number 2 proceeds. This continues until all 5 Pathfinder have finished.

SCORING:

One point given for each nail completely driven into the block.

One point is deducted for each minute used:

EXAMPLE: 19 nails driven 19 points 8 minutes time 8 points Total: 11 points

NAIL DRIVING CONTEST II

PARTICIPANTS: I Pathfinder from each team

EQUIPMENT:

One 16 oz. carpenter's claw hammer, six 10 penny nails, and a two

inch fir board, 10 inches wide.

PROCEDURE:

The nail driving event is an exciting event. A contestant must drive six 10-penny nails through a two-inch fir board ten inches wide. The nails are driven through two pencil lines drawn on both sides of the board exactly opposite each other. Both skill and time are counted. Accuracy is determined by evenly spacing the nails on the pencil line on the top of the board and having them go through so as to pierce the line on the back of the board. This should be done in 30 to 60 seconds.

SCORING:

First place Second place 45 seconds Third place

30 seconds 20 points

60 seconds

10 points 5 points

Note: Deduct 1 point for each inaccurately driven nail

WOOD CHOPPING RELAY

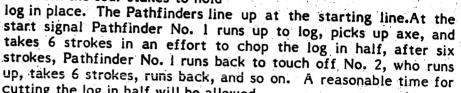
PARTICIPANTS: 3 Pathfinders from each club

EQUIPMENT:

1 log 8" to 12" in diameter, 2'to 3' long. 4 stakes at least 18 inches long for holding the log in position. 1 3/4 lb. head axe.

PROCEDURE:

Make a starting line and an activity line 25' apart. Place the axe and log at the activity line with the four stakes to hold



cutting the log in half will be allowed.

NOTE:

The team will be disqualified for any of the following:

1. If any Pathfinder takes 7 or more chops at log.

2. If judge finds the axe head loose. 3. If any Pathlinder cuts himself.

CHOPPER'S RELAY

PARTICIPANTS: 6 Pathfinders from each club

EQUIPMENT:

I hatchet (sharp), I chopping block

1 board - 6" x 12" x 1"

PROCEDURE:

Mark a starting line and activity line 25' apart. The six (6) Pathfinders will be in relay position at the starting line opposite the equipment. At the sound of the starting gun, the first Pathfinder runs 25', picks up the hatchet and board and splits off one piece of the board (the cut through the board must be complete) and lays the equipment down and runs back and tags Pathfinder #2 - who follows the same procedure until all 6 Pathfinders have completed the event. The pieces must be 12" long to qualify! **PATHFINDERS SHOULD USE UTMOST**

CAUTION NOT TO CUT FINGERS WHEN CHOPPING.
